Saying yes to one act does not mean you agree to another.
Changing your mind halfway through is ok.

If you agree to sex with a condom, and your partner removes it without telling you, it's sexual assault.

Consent is about capacity.

You have to be able to consent.

If someone is asleep, too high or drunk to be able to talk normally, or to remember what they're doing, they cannot consent.



Consent has to be freely given.

If you are scared, threatened, or blackmailed, you cannot consent.

If you're concerned about what happened, or worried that something might happen, get in touch.

Filming someone without their consent is
also wrong.
Sharing nudes of anyone under the age of 18
is illegal, even if they're your own selfies.

you were, or what you were doing, if someone
didn't respect your consent, you are never to
blame.
